In the matter of the application of Southwestern Home Telephone Company for an order extending time for compliance with Chapter 499, Laws of 1911, as amended by Chapter 600, Laws of 1915.

FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

The Railroad Commission having on September 26, 1916, issued its Decision No. 3665, in the above entitled proceeding, granting to Southwestern Home Telephone Company an extension of time to and including December 31, 1918, to comply completely with the provisions of Chapter 499, Laws of 1911, as amended by Chapter 600, Laws of 1915, on condition that at least one-third of the reconstruction work necessary to be done shall be completed on or before June 30, 1917, at least two-thirds on or before June 30, 1918, and the entire work on or before December 31, 1918; and,

Petitioner having on June 5, 1918, filed its supplemental application setting forth that by reason of its financial condition and the increased cost of labor and materials, it will be unable to complete all of its reconstruction work within the time provided in the Commission's decision above referred to, and asking for an order granting a further extension of time for the completion of its reconstruction necessary for compliance with the Laws hereinabove referred to, and it appearing to the Railroad Commission that this supplemental application should be granted and that this is not a matter requiring a public hearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the time within which petitioner herein shall reconstruct its existing system so as to comply completely with the provisions of Chapter 499, Laws of 1911, as amended by Chapter 600, Laws of 1915, is hereby further extended to and including June 30, 1919, provided that progress reports as provided for in Decision No. 3665 shall be filed with the Railroad Commission for each successive period of six months to and including June 30, 1919, as in the manner therein provided.
