ORDER

WHEREAS Coast Counties Gas and Electric Company has applied for an order of the Railroad Commission of the State of California extending the time within which to comply with the provisions of Chapter 499 of the Laws of 1911, as amended by Chapter 600 of the Laws of 1915, known as the "Safety Act", and.

WHEREAS the Commission has found upon inspection of the overhead systems of other companies that a large percentage of statutory violations still existing are of a technical character and do not constitute especially hazardous conditions, and,

WHEREAS Progress Reports of Reconstruction to comply with legal requirements on file with the Commission indicate that applicant has made an earnest endeavor to comply with the previous order of the Commission, and,

WHEREAS it appears that reasons similar to those set forth in this Commission's Decision No. 5934 in Application No. 2145 of Pacific Gas and Electric Company should be employed in our consideration of this matter,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the time within which the Coast Counties Gas and Electric Company shall reconstruct its overhead electric lines to comply with the requirements of Chapter 499, Laws of 1911, as amended by Chapter 600, Laws of 1915, is extended subject to future order of the Railroad Commission, except the particular violations which in the opinion of the Commission are seriously hazardous to employees of applicants or to the general public and of which applicant will be definitely advised following an investigation to be made by the Commission's Gas and Electric Division.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that upon such ad-

proceed to remove the violations designated and to carry on the work in a manner that will cause all such violations to be removed on or before June 30th, 1919.
