O R D E R

Jesse H. Tripp has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by him of an automobile stage line as a common carrier of freight and passengers between Hemet and Babbiste. and intermediate points.

Applicant proposes to charge rates in accordance with a schedule marked exhibit "A" and filed with the application in this proceeding and to operate on a schedule of one round trip daily serving the intermediate community at Aguanga using as equipment one Dodge truck 25 h. p., and one Paige touring car 40 h. p., having a seating capacity of five persons.

Applicant has a contract for the carriage of United States mail over the proposed route and desires the privilege of transporting such limited passenger and freight traffic as may offer over the proposed route there being no other regular transportation service available for the public.

We are of the opinion that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted.

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARIES that public convenience and necessity require the operation by J. H. Tripp of an automobile stage service as a common carrier of freight and passengers between Hemet and Babbiste and intermediate points provided, however, that this declaration shall not become effective until said J. H. Tripp shall have secured from the Railroad Commission a supplemental order herein reciting that said J. H. Tripp has filed herein certified copy of a permit issued by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside in accordance with the provisions of Section 5 of Chapter 213, Laws of 1917; and provided further that the rights and privileges herein granted may not be transferred nor assigned unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such transfer or assignment shall have first been secured.

- IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that no vehicle may be operated under this permit unless such vehicle is owned by the applicant herein or is leased by such applicant under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
