## O R D E R

Henry Johnston has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by him of an automobile stage line as a common carrier of passengers, freight, express, baggage and mail between Ukiah and Potter Valley.

Applicant proposes to charge rates in accordance with a schedule marked exhibit "A" and filed with the application in this proceeding, and to operate on a schedule of one round trip, daily except Sunday, using as equipment one auto truck, one ton capacity, with seating capacity of seven passengers.

Applicant holds a contract for the carriage of United States mail over the proposed route and desires the privilege of transporting passengers, freight, baggage and express, there being no other regular transportation service available for the public.

We are of the opinion that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted.

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity require the operation by Henry Johnston of an automobile stage service as a common carrier of passengers, freight, baggage and express between Ukiah and Potter Valley; provided, however, that this declaration shall not become effective until said Henry Johnston shall have secured from the Railroad Commission a supplemental order herein reciting that said Henry Johnston has filed herein certified copies of permits issued by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Mendocino and the Boards of Trustees of the Towns of Potter Valley and Ukiah City, in accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of Chapter 215, Laws of 1917; and provided, further, that the rights and privileges herein granted may not be transferred nor assigned unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such transfer or assignment has first been secured.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that no vehicle may be operated under this permit unless such vehicle is owned by the applicant herein or is leased by such applicant under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
