ORDER

George C. Boardman, W. W. Jones, W. E. Johnson,
George Long and Harry N. Stetson, as trustees for the stockholders of Western Metropolis Savings Bank, a dissolved corporation in liquidation, has applied to the Railroad Commission for authority to sell and transfer to Emilio S.

Grannucci a certain water distributing system pear the town
of Inverness, Marin County, on certain tracts known as Inverness
Park and Inverness Villa Tract. The public utility property
desired to be transferred is described by applicants as follows:-

That said water plant and distributing system consists of the following: 2 or more large springs on the said lands not subdivided or sold: 3 cement retaining basine at said springs; § 30,000 gallon redwood tank with

its foundations; about 9,762 feet more or less, of one inch, 2 inch and four inch iron pipe and about 18 water meters. Applicants are informed and believe that said tank is of a value of about \$600; said pipe of the value of about \$1,000; said basins of a value of about \$50 each; and said meters at a value of about \$10 cach."

Applicants request that this sale and transfer be deemed to have taken place as of January 15, 1919, in order that the income to be derived from the operation of said water distributing system may be available to Emilo S. Grannucci on and after said date. It appearing to the Railroad Commission that this is not a case in which a public hearing is necessary:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the application be and it is hereby granted, provided that when a conveyance of the property is made in accordance with this order, a certified copy thereof shall, within 15 days, be filed with the Railroad Commission.
