ORDER.

The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company having heretofore filed its application, dated April 23, 1912, for leave, pending the further order of the Railroad Commission, to continue to charge the toll rates in effect on October 10, 1911, except where the same have since that date been reduced, which application sets forth a suggested basis of toll rates to remove all deviations from the long and short service provisions of the Public Utilities Act.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission be and the same is hereby granted to the applicant, until the further order of this Commission, to continue to charge the toll rates in effect on October 10, 1911, in so far as affects deviations from the long and short service rule, except where the rates have since October 10, 1911, been reduced. The Commission will consider the basis submitted by applicant and will hereafter indicate on what basis and terms, if at all, and to what extent it will grant relief from the provisions of section 24-b of the Public Utilities Act.
