OPINION

This case was filed by W. E. Cummins and neighbors against the Los Angeles Gas and Electric Corporation requesting that the defendant be required to extend its mains to serve complainants with gas for domestic uses.

Hearing in this matter was held in April 1918 but owing to the demands of the Federal Government that

extensions which might be postponed should not be made during the war the Commission held in abeyance the decision in this matter pending the return of normal conditions. Following the signing of the armistice and the removal of the restrictions by the Federal Government regarding the use of pipe, Los Angeles Gas and Electric Corporation was informally requested by the Commission to make this extension.

It now appears that Los Angeles Gas and Electric Corporation has, in accordance with the Commission's informal request, made the extensions and is now rendering service to complainants in this case and I therefore recommend that the case be dismissed.

#### O R D E R

W. E. Cummins and neighbors having filed complaint requesting gas service from Los Angeles Gas and Electric Corporation and the defendant having, at the request of the Commission, extended its lines and rendered service to complainants,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled

matter be and the same is hereby dismissed.
