O R D E R

C. Hatamoto has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by him of an automobile stage line as a common carrier of passengers between Holt Station and Old River Bridge and intermediate points in the County of San Joaquin, State of California.

Applicant proposes to charge rates in accordance with a schedule marked exhibit A and filed with the application in this proceeding and to operate on a schedule of six round trips daily between Holt Station and Old River Bridge serving Middle River Bridge as an intermediate point.

The equipment proposed to be operated consists of one White automobile, 30 H. P., seven passenger capacity, licensed by State Motor Vehicle Department under license No. 302192, and one White automobile, 60 H. P., twelve passenger capacity, licensed by State Motor Vehicle Department under license No. 153934.

Applicant proposes to operate over the desired route

in connection with service already established between Stockton and Holt Station and there is no other regular method of transportation available between the points herein proposed to be served.

We are of the opinion that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted.

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity require the operation by C. Hatamoto of an automobile stage line as a common carrier of passengers between Holt Station and Old River Bridge and intermediate points; provided, however, that this declaration shall not become effective until said C. Hatamoto shall have received from the Railroad Commission a supplemental order herein reciting that said C. Hatamoto has filed herein certified copy of permit issued by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Joaquin in accordance with the requirements of Section 3 of Chapter 213, Laws of 1917; and provided, further, that the rights and privileges herein granted may not be transferred nor assigned unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such transfer or assignment has first been secured.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that no vehicle may be operated under this permit unless such vehicle is owned by the applicant herein or is leased by such applicant on a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
