BY THE COMMISSION:

O R D E R.

Charles E. Williams having applied to the Railroad Commission for authority to transfer to Imperial Utilities Corporation his water distributing system at Barstow, San Bernardino County, and the latter company having joined in the application, to which is attached an agreement relating to said transfer signed by said parties thereto, and the Commission being now sufficiently advised in the premises through testimony submitted at a public hearing upon Application No. 3892 relating to transfer to said Imperial Utilities Corporation of a water system owned and operated by The Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Railway Company, and it appearing that no public hearing upon this application is necessary,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Charles E. Williams

be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to transfer to Imperial Utilities Corporation his water system at Barstow, San Bernardino County, including mains, services, valves, meters and other property, together with the use of his reservoir and pumping plant used in connection therewith until said corporation provides itself with reservoir service and water supply facilities.

The above order is upon the following conditions:

1. The authority herein contained shall extend only to such transfers as may be executed within 60 days from date hereof.

2. Within 10 days after execution of such transfer Imperial Utilities Corporation shall file with the Railroad Commission verified copy of said transfer as may be hereafter executed.

3. Nothing herein contained shall be construed by this Commission or any court, tribunal or public body as a finding of the cost or value of said property to be transferred.
