BY THE COMMISSION

O R D E R

A. J. Kuss has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by him of an automobile stage line as a common carrier of passengers, baggage and express packages between Santa Ana and Serra and intermediate points.

Applicant proposes to charge rates in accordance with a schedule marked exhibit "A" and attached to the application in this proceeding and to operate on a schedule of two round trips daily with an extra round trip on Saturdays and Sundays, using as equipment one sixteen passenger automobile.

Applicant has operated a stage line between Santa Ana and San Juan Capistrano for some years and now desires to make a detour from his regular route along the state highway to serve the community at El Toro and also to extend service from the former terminal at San Juan Capistrano to the community known as Serra, which is a small sea shore resort and camping place.

There is no regular transportation service serving either the community at El Toro or the sea shore resort known as

Serra and the Commission is of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted, applicant having already secured a permit from the Board of Supervisors of the County of Orange, as required by the provisions of Section 3 of Chapter 213, Laws of 1917, and as evidenced by a certified copy thereof filed with the application in this matter.

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity require the operation by A. J. Kass of an automobile stage line as a common carrier of passengers, baggage and express packages between Santa Ana and Serra and intermediate points; provided, however, that the rights and privileges herein granted may not be transferred nor assigned unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such transfer or assignment has first been secured.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that no vehicle may be operated under this certificate unless such vehicle is owned by the applicant herein or is leased by such applicant under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
