## SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

city of SEIMA having requested on May 27, 1919, that the order of the Commission authorizing the City to construct a new crossing at grade some seventy (70) feet or eighty (80) feet north of the present crossing be modified to read fifty (50) feet north of the present crossing; and having also requested that the railroad company be restrained from building any structure on the site of the old crossing; and it appearing to the Commission that these requests should be granted in the interests of public safety;

IT IS HEREBY CRDERED, That permission be and the same is hereby granted the CITY OF SELMA to construct a new crossing at Arrants Street, fifty (50) feet north of the existing crossing, instead of seventy (70) feet or eighty (80) feet north, as stated in the original order.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, That the parcel of land on the railroad right of way covered by the existing crossing shall be kept vacant as regards buildings and structures that might obstruct the view in the future.

The Commission reserves the right to make such further orders relative to the location, construction, operation, maintenance and protection of said crossing as to it may seem right and

proper and to revoke its permission if, in its judgment, the public convenience and necessity demand such action.
