FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER DIRECTING
THE DEPOSIT OF FUNDS.

BY THE COMMISSION:

Pursuant to order contained in Decision No. 5910 of November 12, 1916, the parties have reported disagreement as to the terms upon which service of water through Douglas Ditch may be discontinued, and it appearing to the Commission to be just and equitable that applicants and defendants be permitted to discontinue such service upon payment as proposed by them of the sum of \$500 to their patrons, and that said patrons should be able

to agree upon the proper division of said sum, and it appearing from the testimony that W. E. Frey, Robert Akers, Pat Lalor and Chas. Edner are the persons entitled to said fund:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that upon the deposit with the Commission within 10 days from date of a written instrument executed by applicants and defendants, agreeing to pay to said Frey, Akers, Lalor and Edner or their heirs, representatives or assigns, said sum of \$500, without interest, at any time within one year; said payment to be joint or in the several proportions mutually agreed upon by said four payees: a supplemental order will be entered herein/^{granting} to applicants and defendants leave to discontinue service of water through said Douglas Ditch.
