## ORDER OF DISMISSAL -

The first three of the above proceedings were

filed by Pacific Electro-Motals Company against Pacific Gas and Electric Company, Sierra and San Francisco Power Company and Great Western Power Company, in its endoavor to obtain electric service for the operation of its electro metallurgical plant, and to have established rates for such service. The matter was also investigated on the Commission's own motion.

On the 28th day of November 1917, a contract was entered into by and between Great Western Power Company and Pacific Electro-Metals Company, and in accordance with the terms of this contract Great Western Power Company supplied Pacific Electro-Metals Company with electricity, and has continued to do so. This removes the causes for complaint directed against the Pacific Gas and Electric Company and against Sierra and San Francisco Power Company.

In accordance with the order of the Railroad Commission in Decision No. 5943 in Application No. 3460, Great Western Power Company, filed on June 16th, 1919, a schedule of rates for Electro-chemical and Electro-metallurgical service, effective as of July 10th, 1918, and designated as Schedule No. 513, C.R.C. Sheets No. 152-E, No. 153-E and No. 154-E, which schedule was approved and accepted by the Railroad Commission on June 26th, 1919. The rates named in this schedule, being applicable to the service supplied Pacific Electro-Metals Company by Great Western Power Company, and having

been approved and accepted by the Railroad Commission, satisfied complainant's request for the establishment by this Commission of a rate for the service supplied it. All causes for action against Great Western Power Company being now removed,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled proceedings be and the same are hereby dismissed.
