ORDER

H. N. Richards, V. C. Gorst and H. W. Lowell, copartners in business operating under the fictitious name of
Vallejo Bus Company, have petitioned the Railroad Commission for
an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require
the operation by them of an auto stage or bus line as a common
carrier of passengers between Vallejo and Bay Terrace, and
between Vallejo and Vallejo Annex.

Applicants propose to charge rates in accordance with a schedule incorporated in the application in this proceeding and to operate between Bay Terrace and Vallejo on a half hourly schedule between the hours of 6:45 A. M. and 11:30 P. M.; between the city of Vallejo and Vallejo Annex on a schedule as incorporated in the application in this proceeding, the equipment used being as follows:

Applicants herein have heretofore operated an auto stage line over regular routes entirely within the municipality of Vallejo and authority is now requested to extend operations to a point outside the limits of the city of Vallejo, formerly known as Georgetown and now known as Bay Terrace, such terminal being approximately one-half mile outside the city of Vallejo where the United States Housing Corporation has constructed houses for the employees of the United States Government at Mare Island and vicinity. An extension has also been made to a point, known as Vallejo Annex, which is a new residential district approximately one-half mile outside the city limits of Vallejo.

There is no regular transportation service between Vallojo and the suburban points proposed to be served and the Commission being fully advised and of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary believes that the application should be granted.

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES that public comvenience and necessity require the operation by H. N. Richards,
V. C. Gorst and H. W. Lowell, partners in business, of an automobile stage or bus line as a common carrier of passengers
between Vallejo and Bay Terrace and between Vallejo and Vallejo
Annex; provided, however, that the rights and privileges herein
granted may not be transferred nor assigned unless the written
permission of the Railroad Commission to such transfer or
assignment has first been secured.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that no vehicle may be operated under this permit unless such vehicle is owned by the applicant herein or is leased by such applicant under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
