BY THE COMMISSION.

O R D E R

E. L. ASKIN has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by him of an automobile truck line as a common carrier of freight between Lemon Cove and Three Rivers and intermediate points.

Applicant proposes to charge rates in accordance with a schedule marked exhibit "A" and filed with the application in this proceeding and to operate on a schedule of three trips per week, using as equipment two Dodge trucks; one of one and one half tons capacity, the other of one ton capacity, each equipped to handle four wheel trailer with pneumatic tires.

There is no regular freight transportation service over the route herein sought by applicant and the Commission is of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity require the operation by E. L. Askin of an automobile truck line as a common carrier of freight

between Lemon Cove and Three Rivers and intermediate points; provided, however, that the rights and privileges herein granted may not be transferred nor assigned unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such transfer or assignment has first been secured.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that no vehicle may be operated under this certificate unless such vehicle is owned by the applicant herein or is leased by such applicant under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
