ORDER

Application having been made by applicants for permission to operate a number of cars on trains on the Eighteenth Street Line in the City of Oakland sufficient adequately to transport the passengers desiring to use applicants' service, and it appearing to the Commission that this application should be granted:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Railroad Commission of the State of California give and it does hereby give its consent and authority to operate cars on applicants' trains on the Eighteenth Street line in the City of Oakland adequately to transport passengers desiring service thereon.

This consent and authority is given because of the conditions resulting from the strike of the employees of the San Francisco-Oakland Terminal Railways and shall be effective only until further order of this Commission.
