ORDER

By the Commission.

SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY, a corporation, having
 on May 7, 1913, filed with the Commission an application for permission
 to construct a spur track at grade across Alameda Street a public high- --
 way in the City of Vernon, Los Angeles County, California, as herein-
 after indicated, and it appearing to the Commission that this is not a
case in which a public hearing is necessary, that applicant has secured
 the necessary permit or franchise from the Board of Trustees of the City
 of Vernon authorizing the construction of said spur track at grade across
 said Alameda Street, and it further appearing that it is not reasonable
 nor practicable to avoid a grade crossing with said street and that the
 application should be granted subject to the conditions hereinafter
 specified.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission be hereby granted Southern
 Pacific Company to construct a spur track at grade across Alameda Street,
 City of Vernon, Los Angeles County, California, on the west side of its
 main line beginning at engineer's station 871+90, to serve the property
 of the Alta Planing Mill as stated in the application and shown by the
 map attached thereto, subject to the following conditions, viz.:

(1) The entire expense of constructing the crossing together
 with its maintenance hereafter in a good and first-class condition for
 the safe and convenient use of the public shall be borne by applicant.

(2) Said crossing shall be constructed of a width not less
 than twenty-four (24) feet with grades of approach not exceeding six (6)

percent and shall be ballasted to a depth of not less than six (6) inches with first-class gravel or stone ballast and in every way made safe for passage thorough of vehicles and other road traffic.

(3) The Commission reserves the right to make such further orders relative to the location, construction, operation, maintenance and protection of said crossing as to it may seem right and proper, and to revoke its permission if, in its judgment, the public convenience and necessity demand such action.
