O R D E R

C. A. BRANCH has petitioned the Railroad Commission for authority to sell and transfer and G. J. Panario, P. W. Dongan and Wm. H. Curtis, a partnership, have petitioned for authority to purchase, acquire and hereafter operate an automobile stage line between Sausalito, Marin County, and Santa Rosa, Sonoma County, and intermediate points; the rights and privileges for which transfer is desired being those covered by a certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by the Railroad Commission to C. A. Branch under date of November 30, 1917, (Decision No. 4914 on Application No. 3313).

The proposed transfer is to be made in accordance with a bill of sale, copy of same attached to the application in this proceeding and designated as exhibit "B".

The Commission is of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this application be and the

same hereby is granted subject to the following conditions:

1 - Applicant, C. A. Brauch, is to immediately cancel, in accordance with the provisions of General Order No. 51 and other regulations of this Commission, all time schedules and tariffs now on file with this Commission in his name.

2 - Applicants, G. J. Panario, P. W. Dongan and Wm. H. Curtis, a partnership, shall coincidentally with the cancellation of the tariffs and schedules of C. A. Brauch file new tariffs and schedules or adopt as their own tariffs and schedules at the same rates of fare as those heretofore on file with this Commission in the name of C. A. Brauch.

3 - The rights and privileges, transfer of which is hereby authorized, may not again be transferred or assigned unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such transfer or assignment has first been secured.

4 - No equipment may be operated under the authority conferred by this transfer of operative rights unless such equipment is owned by applicants, G. J. Panario, P. W. Dongan and Wm. H. Curtis, a partnership, or is leased by such partnership under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
