ORDER

A formal complaint entitled as above was filed with the Railroad Commission by W. B. Love and others, in regard to the service rendered by John T. Gaffey as owner of a public utility water system operating in a certain portion of San Pedro and vicinity.

A public hearing was called in this matter and it developed that it was proposed that the water system in question be transferred to the City of Los Angeles. Subsequently a joint application was filed with this Commission for an order authorizing John T. Gaffey and Arcadia B. deGaffey, his wife, to sell said public utility property to the City of Los Angeles (Application No. 4878), and a decision granting this application was issued by the Commission on October 2, 1919.

As John T. Gaffey is no longer the owner of the water system concerning which the above entitled complaint is brought,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the complaint of W. B. Love et al in the above entitled procedure, be and the same is hereby dismissed.
