BY THE COMMISSION:

O R D E R

T. J. Berge has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by him of an automobile stage line as a common carrier of passengers and express between Mission San Jose and Irvington.

Applicant proposes to charge rates in accordance with a schedule marked exhibit "A" and filed with the application in this proceeding and to operate daily service connecting with mail trains passing through Irvington; using as equipment one-seven passenger Studebaker automobile, licensed by State Motor Vehicle Department under License No. 464268.

Applicant is engaged in the carriage of United States mail between Irvington and the community at Mission San Jose and desires authority to carry passengers and express packages in connection with his mail route. There is no other transportation service available for the public over the route herein proposed and we are of the opinion that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted.

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity require the operation by T. J. Berge of an automobile stage line as a common carrier of passengers and express packages between Mission San Jose and Irvington; provided, however, that the rights and privileges hereby authorized may not be transferred nor assigned unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such transfer or assignment has first been secured.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that no vehicle may be operated under this certificate unless such vehicle is owned by the applicant herein or is leased by such applicant under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
