REFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

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In the Matter of the Application of WINLIAM GIMINIANI, and HENRY GROSS, for certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate an automobile stage for the transportation of passengers, baggage and express between Bakersfield and Buttonwillow.

BY THE COMMISSION:

ORDER

William Giminiani and Henry Gross, partners in business under the firm name and style of Bakersfield-Buttonwillow Stage Line, have petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity requires the operation by them of an automobile stage line as a common carrier of passengers, baggage and express between Bakersfield and Button-willow and intermediate points.

A public hearing on this application was conducted by Examiner Handford at Bakersfield, the matter was duly submitted and is now ready for decision.

At the hearing on this application it was developed by evidence presented that, instead of a certificate of public convenience and necessity being desired by the applicants herein, the matter properly before the Commission for decision was the approval of the transfer of the operative rights heretofore held by William Giminiani and Mike Giminiani, partners in business operating an automobile stage line between Bakersfield and Button-willow; Mike Giminiani withdrawing from the partnership and being replaced by Henry Gross and it was stipulated at the hearing that the application should be considered as requesting the approval of the Railroad Commission to the transfer of the operative rights instead of on the basis of a certificate of public convenience and necessity.

The transfer of the operative rights is to be made in accordance with the provisions of an agreement, a copy of which is included in an affidavit signed by Henry Gross, one of the applicants herein, and filed in this proceeding.

At the hearing on this application there was no objection on the part of the protestants to the granting of same on the basis of a transfer of existing operating rights heretofore held by William Giminiani and Mike Giminiani as a co-partnership and the Commission being fully advised is of the opinion that the application, as amended and as now requesting transfer of operative rights, should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that a transferof the operative rights for the operation of an automobile stage line as a common carrier of passengers, baggage and empress between Bakersfield and Buttonwillow and intermediate points, as heretofore held by William Giminiani and Mike Giminiani, as partners in business, be approved as regards transfer to William Giminiani and Henry Gross, as

partners in business subject to the following conditions:

- I William Giminiani and Mike
 Giminiani will be required to immediately
 cancel all tariffs and time schedules now
 on file with the Railroad Commission, such
 cancellation to be in accordance with the
 provisions of General Order No. 51 and
 other regulations of the Railroad Commission.
- Partners in business, will be required to file in their own name, or to adopt as their own the tariffs and time schedules as heretofore filed with the Railroad Commission by William Giminiani and Mike Giminiani; all rates to be in accordance with those heretofore filed with the Railroad Commission by William Ciminiani and Mike Giminiani.
- III The rights and privileges, transfer of which are hereby authorized, may not again be transferred or assigned unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such transfer or assignment has first been secured.

IV - No vehicle may be operated under this authority for transfer unless such vehicle is owned by applicants, William Giminiani and Henry Gross, partners in business, or is leased by such partnership under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
