O R D E R

Percy L. Bliss, Fred V. Fish, Walter Williams and Albert Pietronave, a co-partnership, are operating an auto stage line between Oakland and Martinez under the fictitious name of the Bay Shore Stage Company by authority of this Commission under date of December 3, 1918, Application No.4208.

James B. Clark, 2000 San Pablo Avenue, Oakland, desires to purchase all of the interests in the Bay Shore Stage Company now owned by Fred V. Fish, 1600-48th Avenue, Oakland, together with all the rights, interests, permits, privileges, licenses and franchises belonging to Fred V. Fish. All of the members

of the co-partnership have consented in writing, as per exhibit attached to the application, to the transfer and have joined in the request for the transfer to Jas. B. Clark, the total amount to be paid by James B. Clark to Fred V. Fish as set forth in the agreement is Two Hundred and Fifteen Dollars (\$215.00). The interest to be transferred covers only the rights of Fred V. Fish in the Bay Shore Stage Company to operate under the conditions and provisions of the permission granted by the Railroad Commission in Application No.4208 and includes no equipment, supplies, material

or other property.

We are of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this application be, and the same hereby is, granted.
