BY THE COMMISSION:

O R D E R

Louis E. Smith, George R. Zurfluh and Gino Antichi, co-partners doing business under the firm name and style of United Stage Company, and Tom. A. Stuart and R. O. Douglass, a co-partnership, have petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order authorizing the sale and transfer of a certain stage line heretofore operated by said United Stage Company between Placerville, El Dorado County, and Sacramento, Sacramento County; applicants Smith, Zurfluh and Antichi desiring to sell and transfer and applicants Stuart and Douglass desiring to purchase, acquire and hereafter operate said stage line.

The proposed transfer is to be made in accordance with a bill of sale, copy of which is attached to the application in this proceeding.

We are of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY-ORDERED that this application be and the same hereby is granted subject to the following conditions:

I - Applicants, Louis E. Smith, George R. Zurfluh and Gino Antichi, co-partners doing business under the firm name and style of the United Stage Company, will be required to immediately cancel all tariffs and time schedules now on file with the Railroad Commission, such cancellations to be in accordance with General Order No. 51 and other regulations of the Railroad Commission.

II - Applicants, Tom. A. Stuart and R. O. Douglass, a co-partnership, will be required to file new tariffs and schedules in their own name, or to adopt as their own, the tariffs and schedules heretofore filed by applicants, Smith, Zurfluh and Antichi, as a co-partnership under the firm name and style of the United Stage Company; all rates to be in accordance with those heretofore filed by Smith, Zurfluh and Antichi.

III - The rights and privileges, transfer of which are hereby authorized, may not again be transferred nor assigned unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such transfer or assignment has first been secured.

IV - No vehicle may be operated under the authority for transfer herein contained unless such vehicle is owned by such applicants or is leased by them under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
