Decision No. 7253



BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

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In the matter of the application of WILLIAM NIEMANN for certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate express service between Cardens, Monets and Los Angeles.

Application No. 4599.

BY THE COMMISSION:

OBINION

William Niemann applies for authority to establish service for the transportation of express matter between Gardena, Moneta, Los Angeles and Intermediate points.

A public hearing on the application was held DY EXEMINET MESTOVET AT LOS Angeles, March 5th.

At the hearing the protestants stated that they were prepared to show that there was no need for additional service in transporting general express matter. It appearing, however, that applicant has operated continuously since February, 1917, at which time the law did not require him to procure a certificate of public convenience and necessity and that he has filed tariff and schedule as

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required by the Commission and that the commodities transported are dairy products, the protestants offered to withâraw the objection if his service were limited to dairy products, to which limitation the applicant agreed.

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William Nicmann having applied to the Commission for permission to establish service for the transportation of express matter between Gardena, Moneta, Los Angeles and intermediate points, a public hearing having been held thereon and the matter being submitted and ready for decision.

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity requires the operation by William Niemann of an automobile truck line as a common carrier between Gardona, Moneta and Los Angeles over the route set forth in Exhibit B attached to his application,

PROVIDED. HOWEVER, that the authority hereby granted shall be confined to the transportation of milk and dairy products between such points and that only such return shipments may be handled as may be destined to the various ranches and other shippers from whom milk is collected and transported to Los Angeles, such shipments to consist: of grain, mill stuff, food and other products or merchandise necessary in the conduct of the dairying business. This authority does not authorize the general carriage of freight, the business of the applicant being principally that of milk hauling.

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PROVIDED. FURTHER, that the rights and priviloges hereby granted may not be transferred nor assigned unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such transfer or assignment has first been procured.
