James B. Clark, Walter Williams, Albert Pietronave and Percy L. Bliss, a co-partnership, are operating an automobile stage line between Oakland and Martinez under the fictitious name of the Bay Shore Stage Company.

Applicant James B. Clark, 1100 Clay Street, Oakland, desires to sell all of his interests in the Bay Shore Stage Company, to Walter Williams, Albert Pietronave and Percy L. Bliss, a co-partnership and the members have consented in writing, as per exhibit attached to the application, to the transfer, and have joined in the request of the purchase of James B. Clark's interests. The total amount to be paid by Walter Williams, Albert Pietronave and Percy L. Bliss to James B. Clark, as set forth in agreement is Sixteen Hundred Dollars (\$1600.00)

The interests to be transferred are those set forth in Exhibit "A" and filed with the application in this proceeding, including rights of James B. Clark in the Bay Shore Stage Company by reason of transfer of Fred V. Fish's interest to James B. Clark, granted by the Railroad Commission in Application No. 5225, Decision No. 7189, decided February 27, 1920.

We are of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this application be, and the same hereby is, granted.
