O R D E R

Oildale Water Company, a public utility water company owned and operated by Ida J. Barnett, and engaged in the business of distributing water to consumers in a certain community known as Oildale, located in Kern County, California, having made application to the Railroad Commission as entitled above, for authority to sell and transfer to Oildale Mutual Water Company its public utility property more particularly described in Exhibit A attached to the application herein and made a part hereof, and Oildale Mutual Water Company having joined in said application; and an investigation of the water system and properties herein sought to be transferred having been made by representatives of the Commission's engineering department, and it appearing that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that public convenience will be served by the granting of said application,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled application be, and the same is hereby granted, upon the following conditions:

1. Oildale Mutual Water Company, upon assuming possession and control of the properties of Oildale Water Company, shall continue the service of water to consumers theretofore served by Oildale Water Company, and, provided it delivers water to anyone other than its stockholders, it shall file with the Railroad Commission within thirty (30) days of the date of this order a schedule of its rates and charges, together with a copy of its rules and regulations for service as a public utility.

2. The consideration given for the transfer of said public utility water system shall not be urged before this Commission or any other public body as a finding of value of said properties for rate fixing or any purpose other than the transfer herein authorized.

3. The authority herein granted to transfer said water system shall apply only to such transfer as may have been made on or before June 30, 1920, and a certified copy of the instrument of conveyance transferring the property herein authorized to be transferred shall be filed with the Commission within thirty days of the date on which it is filed.

4. Within ten (10) days from the time when Oildale Mutual Water Company actually acquires possession of the properties herein authorized to be transferred, said company shall file a certified statement with the Commission indicating the date of such transfer.
