ORDER OF DISMISSAL

Monrovia Telephone and Telegraph Company, on August 4, 1919, having filed its application in the above entitled proceeding asking the Railroad Commission for an order authorizing applicant to continue in effect certain charges theretofore provided for in Order Number 1931, Bulletin Number 5, issued by the Postmaster General of the United States on August 28, 1918, as modified by Bulletin Number 8, issued September 14, 1918, and Bulletin Number 15, issued November 18, 1918, and differing from the charges theretofore filed with the Railroad Commission under its Decision Number 2879, decided November 5, 1915, and in effect, and the Railroad Commission having on August 1, 1919, issued its General Order Number 57, in the matter of the rates and charges, rules and regulations of all telephone utilities operating in the State of California, providing, in part, that all of said telephone utilities shall immediately resume and put into effect all of the rules and regulations applicable to such utilities set forth in this Commission's Decision Number 2879 and the rules and regulations filed with this Commission by said utilities in accordance

with and under the purview of said decision,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the application herein be and it is hereby dismissed.
