ORDER OF DISMISSAL

Good cause appearing and the Commission being fully advised, it is of the opinion that this is a matter on which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be dismissed.

For the reason that John J. Haygoe is now and has been operating, in good faith, a passenger stage service between Alpaugh and Angiola since prior to May 1, 1917 and that subsequent thereto he filed tariffs with the Railroad Commission, it is not necessary that he secure a certificate of public convenience and necessity and his application, therefore, should be dismissed.
