FIFTH SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER.

WHEREAS, applicant reports that it obtained from the sale of \$7,500,000.00 of bonds, authorized by Decision Number 6864, dated November 24, 1919, the sum of \$6,977,436.33, and expended of the proceeds \$6,166,211.31, pursuant to the authority heretofore granted by the Railroad Commission in supplemental orders in this proceeding, and that there now remains a balance of \$811,225.02 on deposit in a special trust fund with Harris Trust and Savings Bank of Chicago; and

WHEREAS, applicant reports that during February 1920, it has expended for new construction the sum of \$1,305,661.53, as set forth in the statement attached to the fifth supplemental petition in the above entitled matter and, therefore, asks permission to withdraw from the special trust fund referred to, the sum of \$811,225.02, and the Commission being of the opinion that applicant's request should be granted as herein provided;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON COMPANY be, and it is hereby, granted authority to withdraw \$811,225.02 from the special trust fund created through, and as a result of, the sale of \$7,500,000.00 of bonds, the issue of

which was authorized by Decision Number 6864, dated November 24, 1919, to pay for and finance in part the cost of the properties set forth in the statement attached to the fifth supplemental petition in the above entitled matter.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, that Decision Number 6864, dated November 24, 1919, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect, except as modified by this Fifth Supplemental Order.
