BY THE COMMISSION:

O R D E R

J. P. Tucker, operating under the fictitious name of Tucker Truck and Transportation Company, has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by him of an automobile truck line as a common carrier of freight between Los Angeles, Saticoy and Santa Paula.

A public hearing on this application was conducted by Examiner Handford at Los Angeles at which time the matter was duly submitted and is now ready for decision.

Applicant proposes to charge rates in accordance with a schedule marked exhibit "A" and attached to the application in this proceeding; to operate on a schedule of one round trip daily, except Sundays, using as equipment one two ton Winther truck.

Applicant has operated between the points proposed

to be served for the past three or four years but has not given regular operation and now desires to establish regular operation in accordance with the statutory law and the regulations of the Railroad Commission.

At the hearing on this application there was no appearance protesting the granting of the desired certificate and it appears that applicant has secured permits from the Board of Public Utilities of the City of Los Angeles, the Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County and the Board of Trustees of the City of Santa Paula also that the merchants of Santa Paula by a petition to the Railroad Commission have expressed a desire for the establishment of the regular service as proposed by applicant herein.

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity require the operation by J. P. Tucker , operating under the fictitious name of Tucker Truck and Transportation Company, of an automobile truck line as a common carrier of freight between Los Angeles, Saticoy and Santa Paula ; provided, however, that the rights and privileges hereby granted may not be transferred or assigned unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such transfer or assignment has first been secured.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that no vehicle may be operated under this certificate unless such certificate is owned by the applicant herein or is leased by such applicant on a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
