O R D E R

Mr. Jack Kieth, whose address is 170 West Santa Clara Street, San Jose, has made application petitioning the Railroad Commission for certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate a passenger automobile service between San Jose and California Redwood Park, also known as the Big Basin.

There is now no through passenger service between the points proposed to be served, and the establishment of a passenger automobile service would be a great convenience to the traveling public.

We believe this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY DECLARED that public convenience and necessity require the establishment of an automotive passenger service between San Jose and California Redwood Park, also known as the Big Basin, and that a certificate should be and the same is hereby granted, subject to the following conditions:

1- That the applicant, Jack Kieth, shall file with the Railroad Commission a written acceptance of this certificate within twenty (20) days from the date of service hereof and that

operation of such service will commence within ninety (90) days from the date of service hereof.

2- That the applicant, Jack Kieth, will be required to immediately file a tariff of rates, rules and regulations and a time schedule in accordance with provisions of General Order No.51 and other regulations of the Railroad Commission.

3- The applicant, Jack Kieth, will not be permitted to carry local passengers between San Jose and Saratoga nor between any intermediate points over the route traversed between San Jose and California Redwood Park, also known as Big Basin, but will confine his business to carrying through passengers to and from California Redwood Park (Big Basin) only.

4- That the rights and privileges hereby authorized may not be leased, transferred nor assigned unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such lease, transfer or assignment has first been secured.

5- That no vehicle may be operated by the applicant, Jack Kieth, unless such vehicle is owned by said applicant or is leased by him under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
