BY THE COMMISSION.

O R D E R

B. M. Jones is the owner of a small pumping plant with well, tank, water pipes, motor, etc., used in supplying water for his own use and to certain other consumers at Moneta, Los Angeles County, California.

In the above entitled proceeding B. M. Jones makes application for authority to sell and transfer said water plant and system to Wm. H. Guthrie, and said Wm. H. Guthrie joins in the application and asks for authority to purchase the same.

And it appearing to the Railroad Commission that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that said application be and the same is hereby granted, subject to the following conditions:

1. The consideration given for the transfer of said public utility water system shall not be urged before this Commission or any other public body as a finding of value of said properties for rate fixing or any purpose other than the transfer herein authorized.

2. The authority herein granted to transfer said water system shall apply only to such transfer as may have been made on or before September 1, 1920.

3. Within ten (10) days of the date when B. M. Jones actually relinquishes control and possession of the properties herein authorized to be transferred, he shall file a certified statement with the Commission indicating the date on which he relinquished such control and possession.
