ORDER

Application having been made to the Railroad Commission as entitled above, for authority to transfer certain public utility water property in accordance with the terms of a certain agreement attached to said application, the property which it is desired to transfer being more particularly described in said indenture; and it appearing to the Commission that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the application herein be, and the same is hereby granted, subject to the following conditions:

1. The consideration given for the transfer of said public utility water system shall not be urged before this Commission or any other public body as a finding of value of said properties for rate fixing or any purpose other than the transfer herein authorized.

2. The authority herein granted to transfer said water system shall apply only to such transfer as may have been made on or before December 31, 1920, and a certified copy of the instrument of conveyance transferring the property herein authorized to be transferred shall be filed by the City of San Fernando with the Railroad Commission within thirty (30) days of the date on which it is executed.

3. Within ten (10) days of the date on which Maclay Rancho Water Company actually relinquishes control and possession of the properties herein authorized to be transferred, a statement shall be filed by said company with the Railroad Commission, indicating the date on which such control and possession was actually relinquished.
