O R D E R

T. C. Sedgwick has made application petitioning the Railroad Commission for authority to abandon its automotive passenger stage line between Sacramento and Vacaville, California.

The rights and privileges for the line herein sought to abandon are those acquired by the applicant Sedgwick in Decision 6810 of the Railroad Commission, decided October 29, 1919 on Application 5060, which authorized the transfer of said operative rights and privileges from J. W. Walker to T. C. Sedgwick.

The Western Motor Transport Company also operates an auto stage line for the transportation of passengers between Sacramento and Vacaville and the applicant states that he is unable to operate under present rates and conditions and that the Western Motor Transport Company is now adequately serving the needs of the public desiring stage transportation between the points in question. The Western Motor Transport Company, through its attorney, A. B. Roehl, in a letter dated May 28th agrees to supply any reasonable additional auto stage service

between Sacramento and Vacaville when the service of Sedgwick is discontinued.

The Commission is of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that this application should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that, good cause appearing and the Commission being fully advised, applicant T. C. Sedgwick be and he is hereby authorized to abandon his auto stage line engaged in the transportation of passengers between Sacramento and Vacaville, California.
