O R D E R

The G. & W. Stage Company has made application petitioning the Railroad Commission for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to extend its service from San Jacinto to Soboba Hot Springs.

The applicant now operates an automotive passenger and freight service between Los Angeles and intermediate points and San Jacinto and Gilman's Relief Hot Springs by virtue of Decision 7086 rendered February 5, 1920 on Application 5285. There is at this time no transportation service between the proposed points except private conveyances, and therefore the fact is established that public convenience and necessity will be served by the creation of such service.

The Commission is of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY DECLARED that public convenience and necessity require the G. & W. Stage Company, a corporation, to extend its automotive freight and passenger service between San Jacinto and

Soboba Hot Springs and intermediate points, and that a certificate of public convenience and necessity should be and the same is hereby granted subject to the following conditions:

First, that G. & W. Stage Company, a corporation, will within twenty days of the date hereof file written acceptance of this order, subject to the conditions imposed herein, with the Railroad Commission and that the service hereby authorized will be commenced within sixty days of the date of this order.

Second, that applicant G. & W. Stage Company, a corporation, will be immediately required to file with the Railroad Commission its tariff of rates, fares and time schedule in accordance with provisions of General Order No. 51 and other regulations of the Railroad Commission.

Third, that the operative rights and privileges herein authorized cannot be discontinued, sold, leased, transferred nor assigned unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such discontinuance, sale, lease, transfer or assignment has first been secured.

Fourth, that all vehicles operated by the applicant G. & W. Stage Company, a corporation, must be owned by it or leased by it under a contract or agreement satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
