O P I N I O N

Subsequent to the filing of the application herein, the City of Stockton filed a motion, pursuant to a resolution adopted by the City Council, asking for a continuance in this proceeding until such time as the people of said City shall have had an opportunity to vote upon the question of the purchase or establishment and operation, through public ownership, of a water system for said city.

A hearing was called in the above entitled proceeding, in accordance with the published notices thereof, and thereupon Pacific Gas and Electric Company, applicant herein, withdrew its petition with the explanation that a complete metering of the system is necessary in order to conserve the water supply and render adequate service, and that the company can proceed to install meters under authority granted in Ordinance No. 579 of the City of Stockton, fixing

the water rates at present in effect.

An order of dismissal will therefore be entered in this proceeding.

O R D E R

Pacific Gas and Electric Company having withdrawn its petition in the above entitled matter,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the application entitled as above be and the same is hereby dismissed.

The foregoing opinion and order are hereby approved and ordered filed as the opinion and order of the Railroad Commission of the State of California.
