BY THE COMMISSION:

ORDER

An application having been filed for a certificate
declaring that public convenience and necessity require the
operation by applicants of auto stages for the transporta-
tion of passengers for compensation between certain points on
the public highways adjacent to the City of Long Beach desig-
nated in the application; a public hearing having been held
before Examiner Gordon at Long Beach on June 26, 1920, testi-
mony given on behalf of the applicants and protestants, and
the matter submitted; and it appearing to the satisfaction
of the Commission that public convenience and necessity re-
quire the operation by applicants of auto stages as herein-
after designated,--

NOW, THEREFORE, THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA HEREBY DECLARES AND CERTIFIES that public convenience and necessity require the operation by applicants, as copartners, of auto stages for the transportation of passengers for compensation between the points and over the routes designated in the application, subject to the following conditions:

1. Within ten (10) days after receipt of notice of the granting of said application, applicants shall cause to be filed with the Commission a written acceptance of this certificate.

2. Within thirty (30) days after the making of this order, applicants shall commence operations pursuant to this certificate, failing in which the said certificate shall be deemed revoked.

3. Within sixty (60) days from the making of this order applicants shall obtain from the City of Long Beach the necessary permit or franchise to enable them to operate the service proposed in said application, insofar as the same pertains to operations within the city limits of Long Beach. And should said applicants fail to procure such permit or franchise, or, having procured the same, should fail thereafter to maintain the service described in the application as a through service from a point within the City of Long Beach to a point outside of said city, then this certificate may, upon proper showing to this Commission, be revoked.

4. Operations hereunder shall be carried on

with the equipment and in accordance with the schedules and fares described in the application.
