## <u>ORDER</u>

Los Angeles & Santa Paula Daily Express by Hale

Ayers and Mutual Trucking and Transportation Corporation, a

corporation, have made application to the Railroad Commission,

petitioning for authority to sell and transfer certain operative

rights for the conduct of an automotive freight and express ser
vice between Los Angeles, Santa Paula and intermediate points,

the applicant Los Angeles and Santa Paula Daily Express desiring

to sell and the Mutual Trucking and Transportation Corporation, a

corporation, desiring to purchase, acquire and hereafter eperate

said service.

The operative rights and privileges herein sought to be transferred are those acquired by the applicant Los Angeles and Santa Paula Daily Express by reason of this Commission's Decision No. 6878 , November 28, 1919 in Application No. 4886.

The transfer of the operative rights and privileges herein authorized is to be made upon an agreement contained in the application in this proceeding.

The Commission is of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this application should be and the same hereby is granted subject to the following conditions.

- 1. That the applicants Ios Angeles and Santa Paula Daily Express and the Mutual Trucking and Transportation Corporation, a corporation, will within twenty (20) days from the date hereof, file with the Railroad Commission a written acceptance of this order, subject to the conditions imposed herein.
- 2. That the applicant Los Angeles and Santa Paula Daily Express will be immediately required to cancel its tariffs and time schedules in accordance with the provisions of General Order No. 51 and other regulations of the Railroad Commission.
- 3. The applicant Mutual Trucking and Transportation Corporation, a corporation, will be immediately required to file a tariff of rates and charges and a time schedule or to adopt as its own tariffs and time schedules now on file with the Railroad Commission by applicant Los Angeles and Santa Paula Daily Express. All rates, charges and time schedules must be identical with those now on file with the Railroad Commission by applicant Los Angeles and Santa Paula Daily Express.

- 4. The operative rights herein authorized must not be discontinued, transferred, sold, leased nor assigned unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such discontinuance, transfer, sale, lease or assignment has first been secured.
- 5. No vehicle may be operated by the applicant Mutual Trucking and Transportation Corporation, unless such vehicle is owned by it under a contract or agreement satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
