SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

This Commission having by Decision No. 7809, dated June 28, 1920, made its order in the above entitled proceeding, and it appearing that certain typographical errors occur in the schedule of rates established therein, which require correction,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Hawthorne Electric and Water Company be and it is hereby directed to file with the Railroad Commission within ten (10) days from the date of this order the following schedule of rates to be charged for water delivered to its consumers, and effective as of the date of the order in Decision No. 7809:

METER RATES

For 400 cubic feet or less, . . . . .	\$1.00
For the next 600 cubic feet, per 100 cubic feet, . . . . .	0.20
For the next 1000 cubic feet, per 100 cubic feet, . . . . .	0.15
For all quantities over 2000 feet, per 100 cubic feet, . . . . .	0.12

FLAT RATES

1. For all residences, . . . . .	\$1.50
For each automobile, . . . . .	0.25
For each horse or cow, . . . . .	0.20

2. Sprinkling or irrigation of lawns, shrubbery, trees, gardens, etc., per square yard of surface actually irrigated, . . . . . \$0.00½
3. Meters will be installed at the expense of the utility upon request of any consumer who desires to be charged at meter rates.
4. The company reserves the right to install meters upon any service and to thereafter charge the meter rates.
