ORDER

L. J. and Herman Richter, owners and operators of a public warehouse located at Dufour Station, Yolo County, having applied to this Commission for authority to increase storage rates from \$1.00 per ton per season to \$1.25; having represented to the Commission that operating costs have practically doubled since the existing warehouse tariff was placed in effect; having shown by operating statements submitted with the application that the annual net revenue from this utility is not unreasonably high; and it appearing to the Commission that the rate proposed by applicants is not unjust nor unreasonable, nor in excess of rates for similar service in the same locality, and that a public hearing in this matter is not necessary.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Railroad Commission of the State of California, that L. J. and Herman Richter be, and they are hereby authorized to publish and file immediately and thereafter place in effect a rate of \$1.25 per ton per season for the storage of beans and grain at Dufour Station, Yolo County, storage to include weighinginto the warehouse and loading out commodities when delivered.
