O R D E R

W. D. Greer Stage Company, by W. D. Greer, has made application to the Railroad Commission petitioning for certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate automotive passenger service between Lost Hills and Associated Camp, General Petroleum Camp and Bellridge Camp.

At the present time there is no transportation service of any kind between the points proposed to be served and the fact is established that public convenience and necessity would be served by the creation of such line.

The Commission is of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that public convenience and necessity require the establishment of an automobile passenger service between Lost Hills and Associated Camp, General Petroleum Camp and Bellridge Camp and that a certificate of public convenience and necessity should be issued and the same is hereby issued, subject to the

following conditions:

1st- That the applicant, J. D. Greer Stage Company, will file with the Railroad Commission within twenty days from the date of service of this order a written acceptance of this certificate and that operation of such service will commence within ninety (90) days from the date of service hereof.

2nd- That the applicant, J. D. Greer Stage Company, will be required to immediately file a tariff of fares, rules and regulations and a time schedule in accordance with the provisions of General Order No. 51 and other regulations of the Railroad Commission.

3rd- That the rights and privileges hereby authorized may not be sold, leased, transferred, discontinued nor assigned unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such sale, lease, transfer, discontinuance or assignment has first been secured.

4th- That no vehicle may be operated by the applicant, W. D. Greer Stage Company, unless such vehicle is owned by said applicant or is leased by it under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
