O R D E R

Northwestern Pacific Railroad Company, a corporation, having on July 23, 1920, filed with the Commission an application for permission to construct an undergrade highway crossing, near Tyrone, in the County of Sonoma, California, as hereinafter indicated, and it appearing to the Commission that this is not a case in which a public hearing is necessary; that an agreement has been entered into by and between the said railroad company and the said county, for the construction of said undergrade highway crossing; and that this application should be granted subject to the conditions hereinafter specified,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, That permission be and the same is hereby granted Northwestern Pacific Railroad Company, to construct an undergrade highway crossing, near Tyrone, Sonoma County, California, at or near Engineer's Station 2626x49 as shown by the map attached to application, and subject to the following conditions, viz:

(1) The entire expense of constructing the trestle, together with the cost of its maintenance thereafter in good and first-class condition shall be borne by the applicant.

(2) The undergrade highway crossing shall be made to conform to General Order No. 26 as to clearances.

(3) The conditions of the agreement attached to the application shall be considered a part of this Order.

(4) The Commission reserves the right to make such further orders relative to the location, construction, operation, maintenance and protection of said undergrade highway crossing as to it may seem right and proper, and to revoke its permission if, in its judgment, the public convenience and necessity demand such action.
