ORDER

The Railroad Commission having on February 25, 1918, issued its Decision No. 5157, granting a certificate of public convenience and necessity to Frank Pellissier and E. S. Moore to construct and operate telephone lines in certain portions of Mono and Inyo Counties, and to publish, file and place in effect certain rates; and said Frank Pellissier and E. S. Moore for good cause having been unable to complete the construction of said telephone lines, and application, as entitled hereinabove, having been subsequently filed with this Commission asking for authority to publish, file and place in effect rates differing from the rates heretofore authorized in said Decision No. 5157, to wit:

For subscribers located not in excess of eight (8) miles from the town of Bishop, a rate of \$2.75 per month,

For subscribers located beyond eight (8) miles and not exceeding fifteen (15) miles from the town of Bishop, a rate of \$3.25 per month,

and it appearing to this Commission that this is not a case in which a public hearing is necessary and that this application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the application herein be
and it is hereby granted, provided that the authority herein
granted shall apply only to such rates as may be published, filed
and made effective on or before September 30, 1920.
