O P I N I O N

Anton Nelson and Manuel Barcia, operating under the fictitious name of Avila-San Luis Obispo Stage Line, have petitioned the Railroad Commission for authority to increase rates and amend rules and regulations for transportation of passengers between San Luis Obispo and Avila and intermediate points.

Applicants have been and are now operating under fares shown in tariff authorized under certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by the Railroad Commission in its Decision No. 7362 on Application No. 5352, decided April 3, 1920.

The fares sought to be increased are from 50 cents present fare to 75 cents, between San Luis Obispo and Avila, and to amend fares for children allowing half fare to apply between the age of three and twelve years.

Applicants' submit in justification for increases statement of revenue and expenses for a period of six months,

which shows a profit for period mentioned. However, this statement does not include salary of drivers, insurance, depreciation or taxes, which if included would show a loss instead of a profit for same period.

The Commission is of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

O R D E R

Anton Nelson and Manuel Barcia having applied for authority to establish the fares and rules and regulations hereinbefore stated for the transportation of passengers between San Luis Obispo and Avila and intermediate.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that said Anton Nelson and Manuel Barcia be and they are hereby authorized to file tariffs effective five (5) days from date of issue establishing the following rates.

Between San Luis Obispo and Avila 75 cents and half fare for children between the age of three years and twelve years.
