O R D E R

E. A. Kuykendall and L. E. Mershon, H. A. Rose, S. D. Mayo and C. T. Mayo have petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order authorizing the lease of the operative rights conferred by Decision No. 7063 on Application No. 4582 to E. A. Kuykendall for the conduct of an automobile freight line between Los Angeles and Bakersfield and certain intermediate points as specifically stated in such decision.

A public hearing on this application was conducted by Examiner Handford at Los Angeles on August 25, 1920, the matter was duly submitted and is now ready for decision.

At the hearing on this application there was no representation on behalf of applicant, Kuykendall.

The proposed transfer is to be made in accordance with the terms of an agreement dated July 20, 1920, a copy of such

agreement being attached to the application and marked Exhibit "A".

Complaint has been made by the Bakersfield & Los Angeles Fast Freight Company against the alleged illegal operation of Applicant, E. A. Kuykendall, and the violation of the order of this Commission granting certificate of public convenience and necessity and the order of the Commission in Case No. 1477, Decision No. 8051, revoking, cancelling and annulling Decision No. 7063 on Application No. 4582 is hereby referred to.

A public hearing having been held, the matter being duly submitted and the Commission being fully advised and basing its order on the findings of fact as appearing in the opinion in Case 1477,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this application be and the same hereby is denied.
