ORDER

The Western Pacific Railroad Company, a corporation, has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order authorizing the abandonment and removal of a siding of about seventeen (17) cars capacity at or near Mable, California, about three miles west of Portola. Applicant alleges that said siding was originally constructed for handling shipments of logs; that said siding has not been used for nearly two years and is now no longer required to serve necessitates of the public and that it is the desire of the applicant to take up and discontinue the use of said siding ; to remove the rails and other materials installed in said siding and to employ them for railroad purposes in other portions of the property of applicant.

The siding herein proposed to be abandoned is 117 feet in length and is shown on a blueprint or station plat marked exhibit "A" and attached to the application in this proceeding.

We are of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this application be and the same hereby is granted.
