ORDER OF DISMISSAL

Compton Transportation Company, a corporation, and Charles E. Cohen have made application petitioning the Railroad Commission for authority to sell and transfer certain operative rights for the conduct of an automotive passenger stage service between Long Beach and Pasadena and intermediate points, the applicant, Charles E. Cohen, desiring to sell and the applicant, Compton Transportation Company, a corporation, desiring to purchase, acquire and hereafter operate such service.

The operative rights herein sought to transfer are those acquired by the applicant, Charles E. Cohen, in Decision No. 7660, June 1, 1920, on Application No. 5460. The applicant, Cohen, has never operated nor has he attempted to operate insofar as this Commission is informed. On page 6 of Decision No. 7660 will be found the following language: "Applicant shall commence the operation

of the service proposed within thirty (30) days from and after the granting of this certificate." Inasmuch as the service authorized by Decision No. 7660 has not commenced, the Commission has revoked the operative rights of applicant, Charles E. Cohen and he, therefore, has no rights to sell.

The Commission is of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be dismissed.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that good cause appearing and the Commission being fully advised this application should be and the same is hereby dismissed.
