ORDER

E. D. Thomas, who owns and operates a telephone system in and about the town of Livingston, Merced County, having asked for authority to sell his system to J. Max Landram for the sum of \$2000.00, the property to be transferred being described as follows:

Switchboard, telephone booth, 1 chair.

All lines, consisting of about -

1000 - 4 x 6 - 30' Redwood poles,
 40 - 40' poles,
 60 - 30' poles (all set) with crossarms
 and insulators,
 200 - miles wire,
 60 telephones.

And it appearing to the Commission that this is not a case in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the application herein be and the same hereby is granted; provided that the consideration given for the property authorized to be transferred shall not be taken before this Commission, or any other public body, as representing for rate fixing or other purposes the value of the property trans-

ferred; and provided further that the authority herein granted shall apply only to such transfer as is made on or before December 31, 1920.

The authority herein granted shall be and become effective only after applicants shall have filed with the Railroad Commission a copy of the Bill of Sale conveying the property herein authorized to be transferred.
