O R D E R

Western Pacific Railroad Company has applied, under the provisions of General Order Number 36, for an order authorizing the abandonment and removal of a certain side track at Swayne, California, said side track having been originally constructed for the handling of logs of the Swayne Lumber Company to Oroville, California. The Swayne Lumber Company having constructed their own railroad into Oroville the necessity for the siding is alleged to no longer exist and the earnings from freight originating at said siding during the calendar year, 1919, amounted to \$31.08, all less than carload shipments.

The matter having been investigated and the Commission being fully advised and of the opinion that this

is not a proceeding in which a formal hearing is necessary
and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this application be and
the same hereby is granted.
