BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Application of
WHITTIER WATER COMPANY, a corpora-
tion, for authority to sell and con-
vey certain real property.

BY THE COMMISSION.

ORDER

WHITTIER WATER COMPANY having made application to the Rail-
road Commission for authority to sell and convey certain real
property, together with the improvements situate thereon, for the
sum of \$24,000, said property being described more particularly
as follows:

"Lots Ten (10), Eleven (11), and Twelve (12)
of Block Five (5), of the City of Whittier,
in the County of Los Angeles, State of Cal-
ifornia, as per map recorded in Book 21,
pages 55 and 56, Miscellaneous Records of
said County, together with all improvements
situate thereon."

And it appearing that although this property has heretofore
been operative, said property is not now necessary to applicant in
the discharge of its public utility obligations, and that public
convenience and necessity do not require the use of said property
by applicant, and it further appearing that this is not a matter
in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application
should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Whittier Water Company be, and it
is hereby authorized to sell and convey said property, subject

to the following conditions:

1. The authority herein granted to sell and convey property shall apply only to such transfer as may have been made on or before January 1, 1921, and a certified copy of the instrument of conveyance shall be filed with the Commission by said Whittier Water Company within thirty (30) days from the date on which it is executed.
2. Within ten days of the date on which Whittier Water Company actually relinquishes control and possession of the properties herein authorized to be transferred, said Whittier Water Company shall file with the Railroad Commission a certified statement indicating the date on which such control and possession was relinquished.
